

DAYTONA EXECUTIVE MEETING

November 10. 2022

The Executive Committee meeting was held at the Halifax River Yacht Club in Daytona Beach. The following members of the Executive Committee were in attendance; Cdr. Paul Martines, JN; D/C Jeff Wise,

JN; P/C Don Roman, AP; D/Lt/C Steve Becker, P; Lt/C Sharon Neitzey; Lt/C Gary Foster, P; Kathleen Foster, S; and Rita Wise, P The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Minutes from the previous meeting are available in the Beachcomber. Minutes were approved with no changes.

Executive Officer Report: Cdr Paul Martines reported for Lt/C Greg Zahornacky. Our squadron has 80 Vessel Safety Checks so far for 2022 with four more possible. We are approaching 2nd place in D23.

Administrative Officer Report: Admin Officer Gary Foster reminded us of the Squadron Dinner Meeting coming up at Red Lobster on Thursday. He needs RSVP's as soon as possible. Published deadline was yesterday and they only have 14 responses at this time. They must give an accurate number to the restaurant so there will be seating and enough servers ready. They would like a response from each member stating YES or NO, so they don't miss anyone. Speaker Jim Judge will not be able to make it due to priorities from hurricane. He is tied up with meetings but will come soon.

Holiday Luncheon is on December 11 at noon at the Palmetto Club. They had only 11 commitments before Exec. meeting. We must give club a firm number and menu selections by December 2, because caterer is having supply issues. We will NOT be able to add people after that date. Please bring one gift per person at about a \$15 value. Auxiliary will help set up decorations and make one basket to raffle off. We will use poinsettias with something around them.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: Lt/C Steve Becker, AP, reported that all accounts are up to date. All our recent expenses and receipts are connected to education fees and materials. Our balance is \$23,507.06.

<u>Secretary Report</u>: Sharon Neitzey asked that officers please send all reports for the Beachcomber by November 24. Sharon created a common squadron calendar that is available on the website, abcdb.club. We can add District and National Events. Send event info to me to be added. Hopefully this will help us in scheduling events.

It's been a really great, busy year, but we need help. Don feels that some courses don't work well virtually, so he has been meeting with students who need additional help with hands-on learning. Don is drafting a letter thanking the Halifax River Yacht Club for their help and our squadron will give a donation to help with expenses.

Commander Report: Cdr Paul Martines reported that Sea Tow is promoting Life Jacket Loner program. They are looking for sponsors to man a stand. We would need to apply for a grant to do it. We will check on requirements and apply. It's Merit Mark time. Paul sent out forms that need to be turned in ASAP so you can get credit for the work you have done this year. Bridge officers please remind your volunteers. Anyone with questions should check with Paul. He is interested in having an OT class for newer members at the first of the year.

Auxiliary Report: In Connie's absence, Paul reported that the Executive Committee will discuss and vote tonight on the future of the Auxiliary. The motion stated that we will formally disband the Auxiliary and turn in the charter. We will incorporate its functions into the Administrative Department. After discussion the motion passed. Jeff will call Linda Stevens from National to inform her of this action. The group will be called "The Lunch Bunch" and will continue to help as a hospitality committee. They will provide one basket and will help set up decorations for the Christmas luncheon.





A free vessel safety check (VSC) is an important safe-guard, and our certified examiners will be happyjo perform the check for you. There are no negative consequences if-you don't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends, through education.

The United States Power Squadrons and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary are partners in this valuable program offered to the boating public. All examiners are certified and trained on the latest requirements. The Vessel Safety Check is similar to the review that is performed by the U.S. Coast Guard if you are boarded, except that it is the results.

Our Vessel Safety Examiners will perform a 15 point safety check which includes:

Display of Numbers Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) Fire Extinguishers Backfire Flame Control Pollution Placard Navigation Rules

Registration/Documentation Sound Producing Devices MAR POL Track Placard State and/or Local Requirements Visual Distress Signals (VDS) Ventilation Navigation Lights Marine Sanitation Devices Overall Vessel Condition
