We do this through course work, seminars, Vessel Safety Checks, and most importantly by our members talking to others about boating, safe boating and what they could get from our organization. Get out and promote safe boating and our organization.

Seamanship (Boat Handling) Seminars are now available. Complete the series and you will become qualified as SN (Seaman) in our Club.

Members should know that Boat Handling (Seamanship) follows the ABC3 class for more in-depth discussion of topics. The 2019 Boat Handling curriculum comprises a full six-part Boat Handling Course and six seminars:

Rules of the Road: A Practical Approach

Confidence in Docking and Undocking: Slow-Speed Maneuvering

Boating with Confidence: Handling Your Boat Underway

Anchoring with Assurance: Don't Get Carried Away

Emergencies on Board: Preparation to Handle Common Problems

Knots and Line Handling: The Knots You Need to Know

Students who complete the 2019 Boat Handling course and pass the exam will receive credit for the Boat Handling course and earn the Seaman grade. They will also receive seminar credit for each of the class sessions attended. Class materials can be either e-book, or printed at \$65 per student. VESSEL SAFETY CHECK (VSC)



A major component of a fun filled outing is a reliable boat which has all the necessary equipment operating properly. A free vessel safety check (VSC) is an important safe-guard, and our certified examiners. will be happy to perform the check for you. There are no negative consequences if you don't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends, through education.

The United States Power Squadrons and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary are partners in this valuable program offered to the boating public. All examiners are certified and trained on the latest requirements. The Vessel Safety Check is similar to the review that is performed by the U.S. Coast Guard if you are boarded.

Our Vessel Safety Examiners will perform a 15 point safety check which includes:

Display of Numbers Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) Fire Extinguishers Backfire Flame Control Pollution Placard Navigation Rules

Registration/Documentation Sound Producing Devices MAR POL Track Placard State and/or Local Requirements Visual Distress Signals (VDS) Ventilation Navigation Lights Marine Sanitation Devices Overall Vessel Condition
