

MINUTES from the USPS DAYTONA EXECUTIVE MEETING Respectfully Submitted: Lt/C Sharon Neitzey

The Executive Committee meeting was held at the Halifax River Yacht Club in Daytona Beach. The following members of the Executive Committee were in attendance; Cdr. Paul Martines, D/C Jeff Wise, JN; P/C Don Roman, AP; Lt/C Sharon Neitzey; D/Lt/C Steve Becker, P; and Connie Daniels.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Minutes from the previous meeting are available in the Beachcomber. Minutes were approved with no changes.

Executive Officer Report: Paul Martines reported for Greg Zahornacky. Our squadron has 68 Vessel Safety Checks so far for 2022. District has 396. We are currently third in District 23, and close to second place. We are looking into examining Freedom Boat Club boats but must find out if it is legal. Also looking into a liaison with Freedom Boat Club for boat usage, both locally and nationally, and possibly coupling it with an ad in the Beachcomber. We need additional Vessel Examiners.

Boat Show Committee: Don Roman is scheduling workers. Contact him if you can help. Booth is 10 x 10 with a table and table cover. Background is draped. There are two chairs and no electricity. We will have limited help because of many executive officers travelling that week. Set-up will be done Thursday afternoon by Becky Roman and Ermit Zapada. Friday show is from 10-4. Ermit will handle that with Connie Daniels. Saturday we have Frank and Sharon Neitzey, as well as Lisa Smith and Tom and Genevieve Boles until 2, followed by Tim and Cathy Henke. Sunday we have Joe Luckett and Connie Daniels, followed by Greg and Christine Zahornacky, who will close up and carry materials back to storage. All handouts are organized and ready. Signup sheets for ABC3 class will be available in booth. Class will be October 15 and 22. There are also a few giveaways. Discussed possibility and structure of raffle of basket. Decided to save the baskets for Fall Conference.

Education Officer Report: Don announced that the Advanced Marine Navigation online class is beginning October 5 from 7:30 to 9:30 on Go To Meeting and will last from 12-15 weeks. The ABC3 class will be held October 15 and 22. We will put out flyers and signup sheets at the Boat Show.

Don will check into Marine Discovery Center, NSB, and Marine Science Center in Ponce Inlet for speakers

Auxiliary Report: The Executive Committee decided last month to research assimilating the Auxiliary into the squadron. The plan is to create a Hospitality Committee under the auspices of the Admin Officer to incorporate and centralize all hospitality and current social and service activities under the Administration Department to simplify procedures, accounting, and governance. After researching proper procedures, the committee's plan was to vote at the September Executive Meeting on the restructuring of the Auxiliary. Admin will be responsible to bring everything to meetings and assign helpers. .

A free vessel safety check (VSC) is an important safe-guard, and our certified examiners will be happyjo perform the check for you. There are no negative consequences if-you don't pass. Our goal is simply to help make boating as safe as possible for you, your family and your friends, through education.

The United States Power Squadrons and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary are partners in this valuable program offered to the boating public. All examiners are certified and trained on the latest requirements. The Vessel Safety Check is similar to the review that is performed by the U.S. Coast Guard if you are boarded, except that it is the results.

Our Vessel Safety Examiners will perform a 15 point safety check which includes:

Display of Numbers Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) Fire Extinguishers Backfire Flame Control Pollution Placard Navigation Rules

Registration/Documentation Sound Producing Devices MAR POL Track Placard State and/or Local Requirements Visual Distress Signals (VDS) Ventilation Navigation Lights Marine Sanitation Devices Overall Vessel Condition
